

GIFTED ASSESSMENT - 2025

Approach

During our intake meeting I will be asking specific questions and focus on those behavior symptoms that are closely related to intellectual giftedness and its associated characteristics. This is followed by a standardized assessment to see whether your child meets the criteria for intellectual giftedness.

2-step Process

If it is determined during the assessment that your child does not meet the criteria for intellectual giftedness, which is defined as having an IQ score of 130 plus or minus five, then you will be notified by phone. This also means that you have the option of not paying for a summary report or attending an in-person feedback meeting.

If it is determined that your child does meet the criteria, then you will receive a summary report during the feedback discussion meeting.

Dual exceptionalities: it is possible for children to be both intellectually gifted and have a specific learning disorder, ADHD and/or a processing disorder and/or other factors that may be impacting on the learning and accommodations needed.

Cost

An **initial fee** of **\$720** is due at the first meeting, to include intake interview, assessment materials and administration, scoring, interpretation and analysis.

An **additional fee** of **\$720** is due in the event of a second meeting if the person meets the criteria, feedback discussion and a written summary report.

Total cost for Step 1 & Step 2 with summary report is **\$1,440**.
